The Ohio Academy of Science selected 48 Ohio schools and 615 teachers to receive The Governor's Thomas Edison Awards for Excellence in STEM Education and Student Research for their accomplishments during the 2022-2023 school year. Each school will receive a special Governor's Award certificate, and each teacher will receive a complementary membership to The Ohio Academy of Science. The Technology Division of the Ohio Development Services Agency funded the program.

First established in 1985, the Governor's Thomas Edison Awards recognize Ohio schools and teachers who stimulate scientific student research and technological design and extend experiential opportunities beyond traditional classroom activities. The Ohio Academy of Science initiated this educational partnership program in cooperation with The Office of The Governor and The Technology Division of The Ohio Development Services Agency to recognize schools and teachers for excellence in STEM education and scientific student research.

CCHS NAMED TO ADVANCED PLACEMENT SCHOOL HONOR ROLL

CCHS recognized for student success in Advanced Placement program while broadening access.

College Board, which expands access to higher education, announced that CCHS has been named to the Advanced Placement® Program (AP®) School Honor Roll, earning SILVER distinction. The AP® School Honor Roll recognizes schools whose AP programs are delivering results for students while broadening access. Schools can earn this recognition annually based on criteria that reflect a commitment to increasing college-going culture, providing opportunities for students to earn college credit, and maximizing college readiness.

CCHS had 60% of seniors who took at least one AP exam during high school, 40% of seniors who scored a three or higher on at least one AP exam, and 5% of seniors who took five or more AP exams! They currently offer nine AP courses with six instructors and plan to continue adding more AP course offerings to their curriculum in the next few years.

"AP represents an opportunity for students to stand out to colleges, earn college credit and placement, and potentially boost their grade point averages," said Trevor Packer, head of the AP program. "The schools have shown that they can expand access to these college-level courses and still drive high performance – they represent the best of our AP program."

College Board's Advanced Placement® Program (AP®) enables students to pursue college-level studies—with the opportunity to earn college credit, advanced placement, or both—while still in high school. Through AP courses in 38 subjects, each culminating in a challenging exam, students learn to think critically, construct solid arguments, and see many sides of an issue—skills that prepare them for college and beyond.





Dr. Cara Copeland ('04) was inducted into two honorary dental societies, The American College of Dentists and The International College of Dentists at their respective annual meetings in Orlando, FL in October 2023.

The American College of Dentists (ACD) is the oldest national-level honorary organization for dentists, with only 3% of dentists in the nation nominated for fellowship. Its members have exemplified excellence through outstanding leadership and exceptional contributions to dentistry and society. The International College of Dentists is the preeminent honor society of the world's outstanding dentists in "Serving Others" with chapters in 138 countries. Fellows exemplify the ICD core values of integrity, leadership, and service.

Dr. Copeland resides in Phoenix, AZ with her husband, Bryan and son Dominic. She currently serves as an Associate Professor and Director of Community Service & Outreach at Midwestern University College of Dental Medicine in Glendale, AZ. Her duties include patient care, lecturing, and building community partnerships to provide dental care for the marginalized in her community. Her most recent efforts have resulted in comprehensive dental care for victims of human trafficking and pregnant, unhoused mothers.

Jerome A. Madden ('66) grew up in the Upper Ohio Valley in the 1960's. Jerry holds a B.A. from the College of Steubenville and law degrees from the University of Dayton School of Law and the Georgetown University Law Center. After law school, he served as the sole law clerk for the Chief Justice of the Supreme Court of Ohio, C. William O'Neill. He served in the U.S. Marine Corps (R) from 1970 to 1976. He has practiced law in Washington, D.C., since 1979, including fourteen years with the U.S. Department of Justice. He is the principal of The Madden Law Group PLLC in Washington, D.C. He lives in Northern Virginia with his wife Cyndi, a retired master elementary school teacher. They have two children, Kelsey and Jack; both hold M.Ed. degrees. They have one grandchild, Jamie Maclennan.

What was the motivation to write this book?

I have long been struck by the fact that as I—part of the leading-edge baby-boomer generation—came of age, the two most important pillars of my youth—the steel industry that supported the local economy and the Catholic nuns who made my parochial education possible—went into a death spiral. The reasons for the decline of each were quite different but they occurred simultaneously. The Steubenville area was a vibrant and thriving community that supported solid middle-class families. The world in which I grew up swiftly disappeared.

When did you decide to write Steel Valley?

It's a story I have thought about for at least twenty years. I had the basic idea for the book but could never land on a storyline that I thought would do it justice. A little over a year ago, I was driving in my car while out Christmas shopping and the complete storyline literally dropped into my lap. I went home and typed it up and started writing in earnest last January.

On whom did you base two main characters?

The main male character, Jack Clark, is in some small and not so small ways loosely based on my early years but the rest is fiction. The female muse, if you will, Laurie Carmine, is entirely fictional but in some small but important ways was informed by my personal experiences. The book focuses on first and second generation Irish, Italian, and Polish children of immigrants who emigrated to the U.S. in the mid-to-late nineteenth century through the early twentieth century.

What do you want to most get across to readers about this book?


It's a story that needs to be told and I think it speaks to a loss far beyond the Steubenville area to many, many industrial and manufacturing towns and cities

throughout the U.S. These were thriving communities and I think just in the last ten years has the country started to come to grips with what was lost.

A Catholic education is now affordable for ALL eligible families in the state of Obio, grades K-12!

Governor Mike DeWine, Senate President Matt Huffman, and members of the Ohio House and Senate have passed HB33, Ohio's biennial budget. This landmark legislation includes significant changes to the EdChoice Expansion Scholarship program. ALL students in grades K-12 will qualify. If a family's household income is at or below 450% of the Federal Poverty Level, they will be awarded the maximum scholarship amount not to exceed the school's tuition amount per child. If a family's household income is at or above 451% of the Federal Poverty Level, the student's scholarship award will be prorated.

Please see charts to determine the amount for which you will qualify. Income levels are based on household adjusted gross income (line 11 of your 2022 Income Tax Return).
