Bishop Paul J. Bradley, apostolic administrator of Steubenville, announced the appointment of Deacon Thomas Graham as principal of Catholic Central High School and Bishop John King Mussio Junior High School, Steubenville, effective July 1. Deacon Paul D. Ward, director of the diocesan Office of Christian Formation and Schools, said, "With his many years as an educator and community leader, Deacon Graham is a strong choice for this position. He has the faith, experience, and skills needed to move the schools forward in a positive direction."

Deacon Graham has a master's and a doctorate in sociology from Kent State University, with specialization in analyzing educational systems and policies; a MSW in clinical social work from the University of Pittsburgh; and a master's in theology from St. Joseph's College in Maine. He also has a degree in secondary education with a teaching license.

The deacon was a full-time professor at Franciscan University of Steubenville for 30 years and Dean of Academics at Eastern Gateway Community College, Steubenville, for five years.

Deacon Graham was a commissioner of Jefferson County for 20 years and a member of the Toronto school board for 10 years. He has served as a deacon in the Diocese of Steubenville since 2016.

Deacon Graham replaces Jude Lucas, who announced her retirement earlier this year after 22 years of service as an educator for the Steubenville area Catholic schools. The diocese expresses its gratitude for her dedication.
